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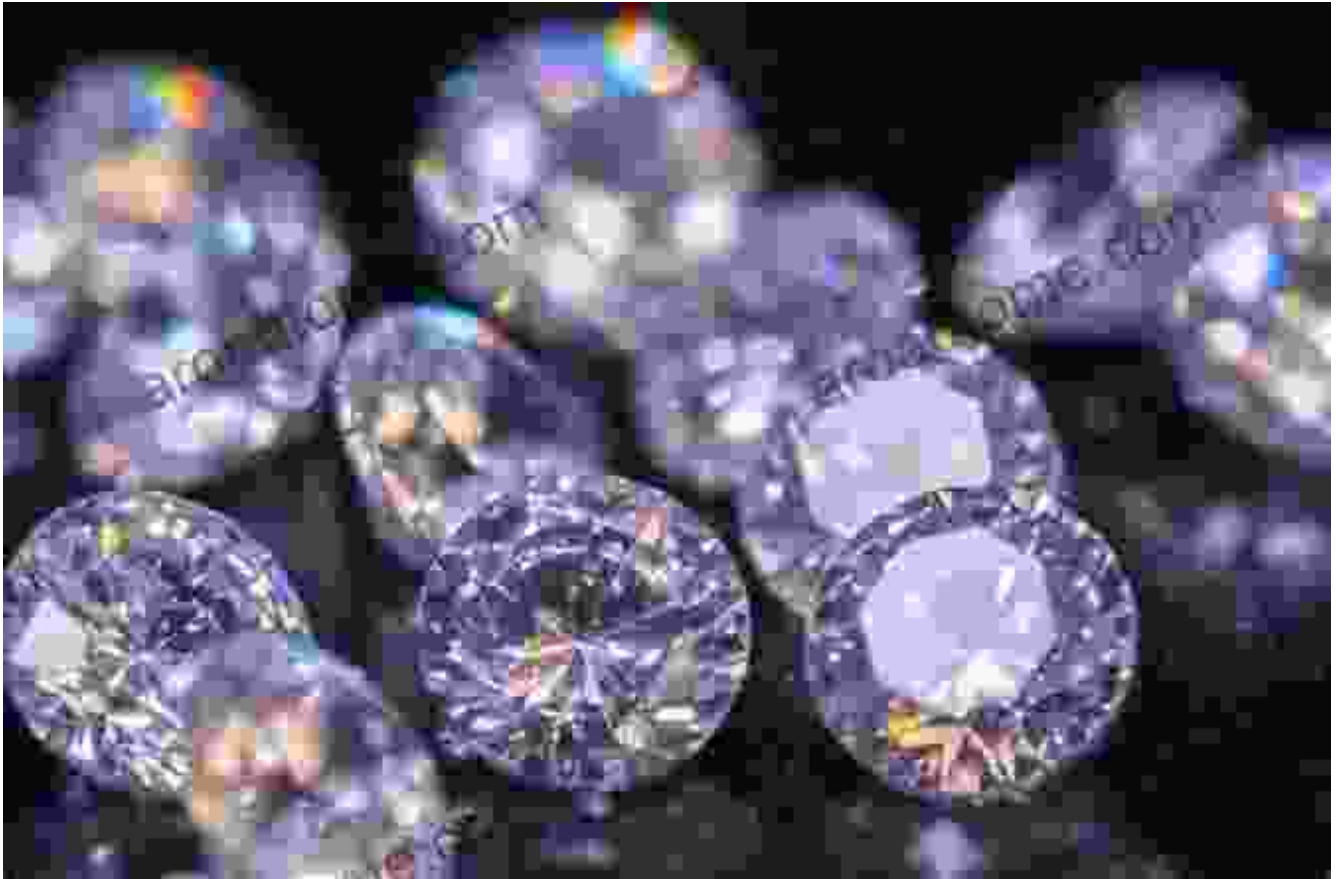

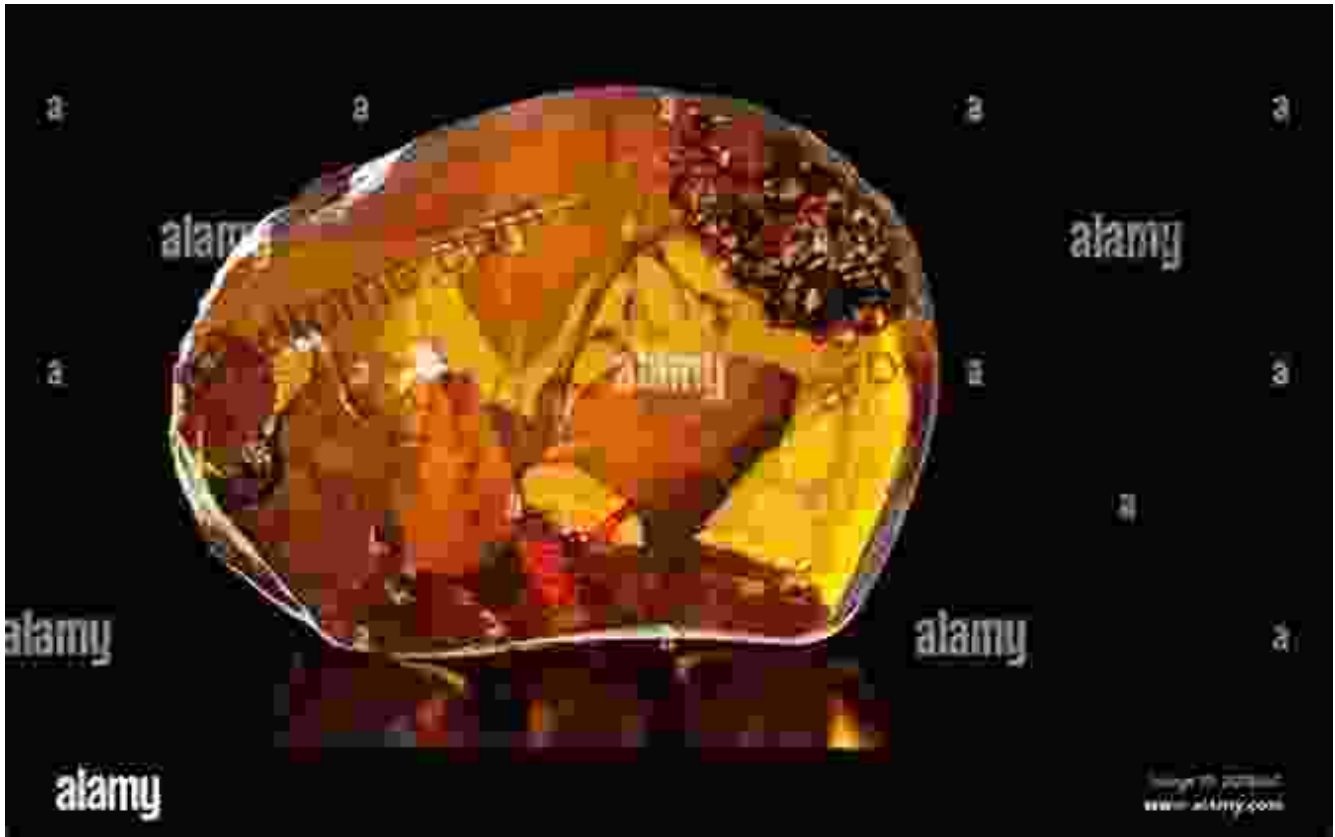
Garnet: The Gemstone of Passion and Protection

Coral: The Organic Gemstone of Marine Origin



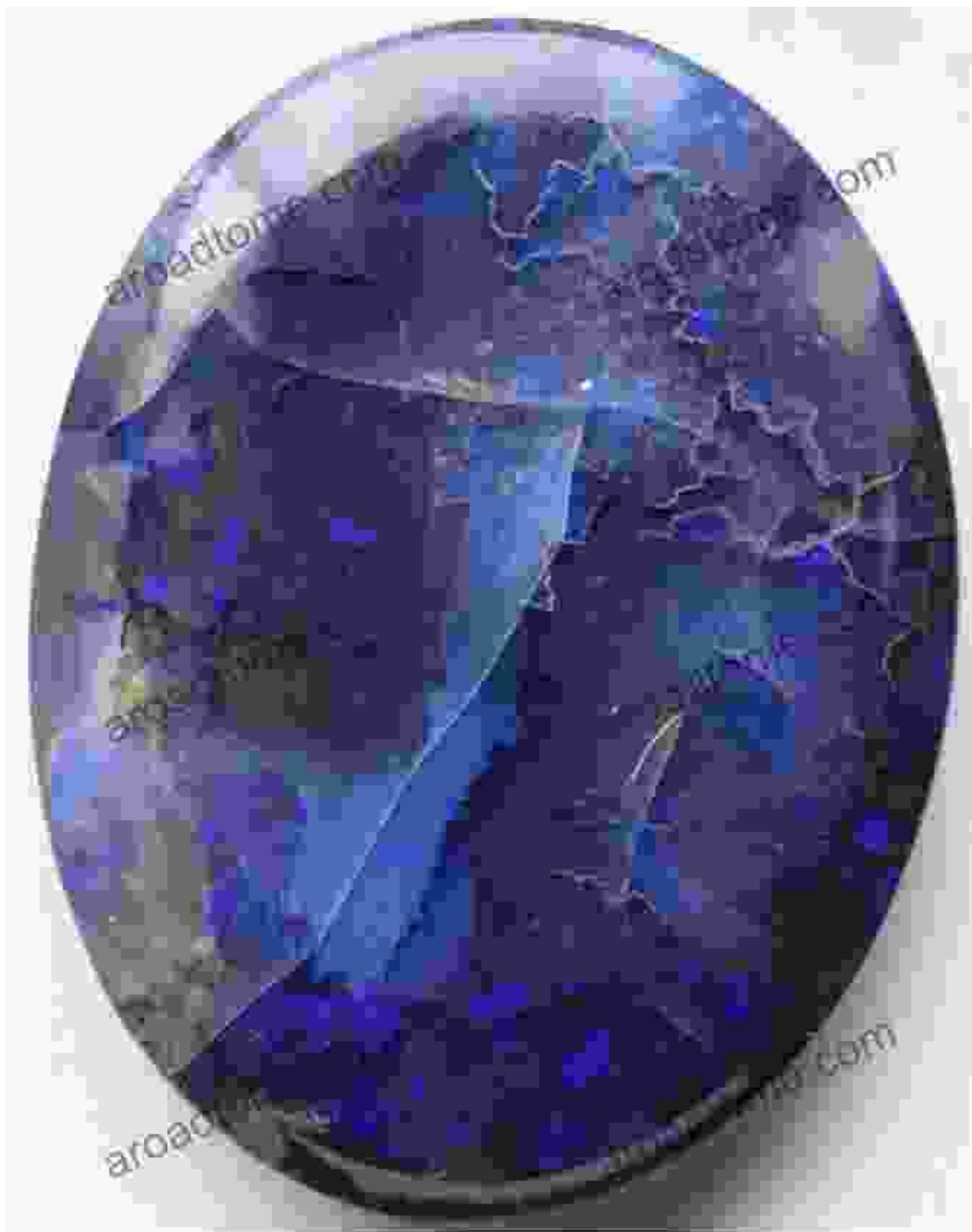

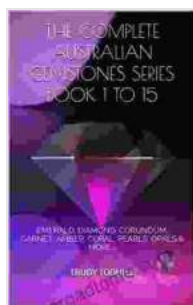
Opals: The Play-of-Color Gemstone

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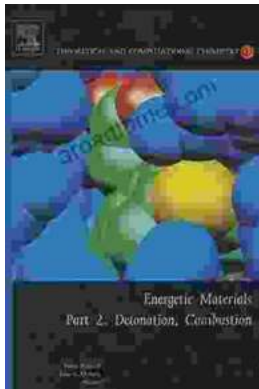
